



Fact Sheet 2025-26 Coventry University Postgraduate Programmes (Coventry Campus and London Campus)



➤ Academic Structure and Calendar

The academic year is divided in 3 semesters at CU: September to January, January to May, May to September.

Most postgraduate programmes offer the possibility to start the programme at either of the semester start dates, i.e. in September, in January and even in May in some cases.

Please consult each programme webpage to see what entry points to choose from to start the programme.

Each programme page will include the following information:

- Course overview: what your programme is about and this includes relevant national and/or international, subject-specific rankings

- What you will study: the list of modules you will be taking during your programme, with allocated credits per module and a summary of the module learning contents.
- How you will learn: the range of teaching and learning techniques the professors will use to help you learn and progress, as well as details of teaching hours and assessment procedures.
- Admission/entry requirements (see also below)
- Tuition Fees and funding (and scholarships where relevant), e.g. with details of European scholarships available for EU passport holders who are also resident in the EU and other possible scholarships and discounts.
- Disciplinary-specific facilities and available equipment.

➤ **Admission criteria on CU postgraduate programmes for students coming from France**

1. Academic Results:

Postgraduate - Successful completion of a Licence with at least "Assez bien".

Applicants need to submit their academic transcripts in English for the three years of their bachelor's degree or equivalent as well as copy of their Licence/bachelor's degree diploma in English (or with a Certified English translation; please find google the list of *traducteurs assermentés* in your area).

2. English language requirements

- IELTS 6.5 (minimum component score 5.5) or other equivalent test showing at least a B2 level of proficiency. Please also check course-specific requirements if any.
- Other tests accepted: Oxford International Education Group's all-online English Language Learning Test (ELLT) as follows:
 - Postgraduate programmes: ELLT Overall 7, min component 5.
 - Where IELTS 7 is required: ELLT 8, min component 5.

3. Letter of Reference:

A referee must write a statement that references the character, personality and behaviour of the applicant. The referee should be from an employer or an academic/teacher, depending on the applicant's background.

Evidence required - The reference must be in colour and signed or stamped by the referee or on an official email.

4. Personal Statement – Statement of Purpose

The personal statement is an opportunity for students to convince us that they are committed to studying in the UK. This statement is more likely to be successful if it references the student's:

- reasons for studying in the UK
- chosen campus location and reasons for choosing it
- chosen course and reasons for choosing it
- career aspirations.

Evidence required - The personal statement can be a maximum of 1,000 words and we recommend students use the full word count.

➤ **Working during your studies**
